MONEY-MONEY-MONEY!

BRIAN ROBINSON reporting on salary survey for Civil Engineers in southern California found that public agencies and private industry are very close, considering salary alone, but public agencies enjoy 7 days more time off and better fringe benefits and pensions.

Entry level salaries in private industry average \$1960 in 1983, an increase of \$260 over 1979 levels, but recommended to be extended another year during which the economy is expected to improve.

IT'S THE LAW

PAUL MC CLAY, Slosson & Associates, has forwarded the following for your edification and pleasure:

SB1195--CERTIFICATES OF CAUSE--IS NOW LAW. Senate Bill 1195, introduced by Senator Leroy Greene, has passed the Legislature and has been signed into law. The Legislative Counsel's Digest said, in part:

Under existing law, in any action for damages arising out of professional negligence of a person licensed as a professional engineer, architect, or land surveyor the plaintiff's attorney shall file a certificate that there is reasonable and meritorious cause for filing the action. The certificate shall be filed on or before the date of service of the complaint on any defendant. The certificate shall contain one of 3 declarations including one that states that the attorney has consulted a licensed architect, professional engineer or land surveyor who is in practice or who teaches at an accredited college or university. Only one certificate need be filed even if there are multiple defendants.

The bill would require the filing of a certificate in an action for indemnity, as well as damages, and require the filing in every action including a cross-complaint. The bill would provide with respect to the declaration that the professional person consulted be in the same discipline as the defendant.


