The November meeting was attended by almost 200 people; the Whitier Narrows Earthquake got our attention for Doug Given's excellent talk. We thank the program chairman Jeff Holt for scheduling this timely talk on short notice. Jeff cannot promise an appropriate disaster each month, but he does promise outstanding speakers.

Although the earthquake stimulated interest for the presentation, it made the Luminaria's Restaurant unsafe for the planned meeting. Fortunately we were able to get into the Quiet Cannon Restaurant on short notice and John Byer saved the meeting by getting out an announcment of the new meeting place. Our treasurer, Jerry Treiman told those who called with reservations about the new meeting place, leaving only a few members who hadn't bothered to get reservations with an extra five miles or so in rush hour traffic.

MORE NEWS FROM THE NOVEMBER MEETING

Eldon Gath announced that plans for the 1988 field trip are already underway. The trip will include stops along the Whittier-Elsinore Fault Zone (planned before the fault was thrust into prominence on Oct. 1) and stops at mass grading projects in southern Orange County.

Buzz Spellman explained that SB 86, which would abolish the State Board of Registration, is not dead. A preliminary hearing is scheduled for December 7 in Palm Springs. Stay tuned for further developments, and be prepared to write your Senator.


Bob Zweigler presented the short topic, which focused on damage caused by the Whittier Narrows Earthquake and provided an excellent lead-in for Doug Given's talk. Doug Given showed that the Oct. I quake occured on a previously unrecognized thrust fault but the Oct. 4 aftershock occured on a strike slip fault. He also presented data that thrust faults similar to the one that caused the Oct. I quake could be more common beneath the L.A. basin than we had thought.
