Earthquakes, volcanoes, weather and climate all generate occasional disastrous side-effects. One of the most certain, if least calamitous, is the temptation afforded to mankind to attempt to forecast the timing and severity of the event. Purely statistical forecasting has the high rate of failure it deserves. Deterministic models of infrequent events such as great earthquakes are not much more useful because of the inability to test either the mechanical/thermal principles or properties in situ.

Forecasting, in which probability of occurrence is related to a driving mechanism of known rate, is a useful device for thinking about large earthquakes and upon refinement, should help in planning. Deterministic climate modeling has recently led to an accurate long term forecast of El Nino independent of statistically interesting precursors.

Faced with frustration at Nature's general intractability, mankind has begun to perform a controlled experiment; namely to increase the opacity of the atmosphere to infra-red radiation by addition of  $\mathrm{CO}_2$ , methane and other gases into the atmosphere. The warming process has already begun and the forecasts suggest that the civil and geological engineering of the next 100 years will be on the beaches.

FROM YOUR CHAIRMAN

The February meeting was started with a short topic on Research of City of Los Angeles Records. The topic was prepared by Jeff Grover and Martin Lieurance, of Grover and Associates. Our main speaker was Professor Walter E. Reed from UCLA, who discussed the effects of oil spills on the marine life in the area of the spill. It was interesting to see how areas recover relatively quickly from spills and the abundance of marine life below the offshore platforms re-establishes itself.

Senate Bill 86, which would eliminate the Board of Registration for geologists and geophysicists, was discussed. The bill has been assigned to committee. Buzz Spellman, President of the Board, handed out information on the bill and reasons for retaining the board. All members of AEG are urged to write their senators,

Senator Boatwright, Senator Montoya and members of the Senate Business and Professions Committee. Please see elsewhere in this newsletter the more detailed information on who, where and what to write.

Chairman Byer announced that the Geotechnical Review Committee will be assembling a directory from responses to the questionnaire. This is the last chance to fill out the questionnaire that accompanied the January newsletter if you want to be in the directory.

The Spring Field Trip is slowly taking shape. The theme will be Unrecognized Geologic Hazards. Anyone wishing to submit papers may do so; however, the book should be ready for printing by the end of April. The cost of the field trip will be around \$30, provided some of the consulting companies donate to the cost of the trip.

Mike Reader of Baseline Consultants indicated they are looking for a Certified Engineering Geologist. Anybody interested can contact Mr. Reader at Baseline Consultants.

Dr. Lamar has scheduled Professor Clarence R. Allen of the Seismological Laboratory of the California Institute of Technlogy to speak to the Southern California Section in April.
